Deadline/Amount	Scholarship/Awards	Description/Criteria
March 11, 2011	NSAC \$38,000 Atlantic Scholars Awards	A renewable entrance scholarship available to top students attending NSAC. Winner must reside in residence for each year the scholarship is held. It can cover the cost of tuition and residence only. Must have a minimum average of 85% in the courses used for university entrance.
March 18, 2011	Harrison McCain Scholarship/Bursary for students planning to attend NSAC	Must have a minimum average of 80%, financial need, leadership qualities and a recognizing initiative in funding their own education.
March 31, 2011 Max. value up to \$2000	Bell Aliant Pioneers of NB Scholarship	Eligible to student who has a physical or mental disability and is a resident of New Brunswick.
May 13, 2011	NSAC Sport Leadership Award	Recognizing a high school varsity athlete enrolled in full-time study at NSAC and planning on participating in a sport at the varsity level at NSAC. Must have a minimum 75% average in the courses required for admission to NSAC.
May 13, 2011 Up to \$1000	Advance Savings Credit Union Bursary	Available to Advance Saving Credit Union owners and their families members who live within the service area of Advance Saving Credit Union and have been accepted to full-time study at university or community college.
May 20, 2011 \$1000	RBC Financial Group Entrance Scholarship to NSAC	Available to a student from a family farm entering the first year of the BSc. (Agri) program at NSAC
May 27, 2011	NBCC Entrance Scholarship	Available to a student entering their first year at any NBCC location
